Sri Lanka being one of the earliest members of UNESCO (since 1949) has been an active partner in most of the UNESCO led initiatives.

Presently, Sri Lanka is a State Party to many Agreements and Conventions of UNESCO.

In addition, Sri Lanka is a member of the International Coordinating Council of the programme on Man and the Biosphere. Furthermore, Sri Lanka held the Chair of the Asia Pacific Group of UNESCO in 2003.

Recent initiatives by Sri Lanka at UNESCO include the resolution adopted by the 36th Session of the General Conference to establish the South Asian Centre for Teacher Development in Meepe, Sri Lanka and the resolution to celebrate the 100th Birth Anniversary of late Prof. Ediriweera Sarachchandra adopted by the 37th Session of the General Conference. A special ceremony was held at the UNESCO Head Quarters in celebration of this Birth Anniversary accompanied by a cultural show and an Exhibition to honour the late scholar. The Agreement between the UNESCO and the government of Sri Lanka to establish the South Asian Centre for Teacher Development was signed concurrently to this event.

Since joining the UNESCO membership in 1949, Sri Lanka has served on the Executive Board only on five occasions.

Being committed to the UNESCO ideal of building peace in the minds, Sri Lanka has the honor to submit the candidature of Hon. Akila Viraj Kariyawasam, Minister of Education, Sri Lanka, for election to the UNESCO Executive Board, during the 39th General Conference in October 2015.

In this regard, the Government of Sri Lanka kindly requests, the UNESCO Member States to extend their valuable support for the candidature of Sri Lanka to the Executive Board of UNESCO.

Academic Pursuits;

Born in 1973 in Kuliyaipitiya, Sri Lanka, Mr. Akila Viraj Kariyawasam had his schooling at Kuliyaipitiya Central College. In his family of 6 members, 5 are graduates. Three of them are lawyers. One is a doctor of law in Australia's Griffith University. It was in keeping with this academic tradition in the family that Akila - who studied at Kuliyaipitiya Central College – was selected to enter the University of Colombo. He obtained a degree in economics, political science and international affairs as well as a degree in law.

Political Achievements;

Akila entered politics while he was studying for his A/L exams at Kuliyaipitiya Central College. Hailing from a family that had traditionally supported the UNP, he chose this party to engage in politics. This was during the time that the present UNP Leader Ranil Wickremesinghe changed the name of the UNP Youth Front into the National Youth Front and went from village to village appointing officials to it. Akila was elected the Chairman of the National Youth Front in Kuliyaipitiya by a large majority. His election as Chairman of the Kurunegala District in 1995, and as a Member of the Working Committee of the National Youth Front was by a majority of over 90% of votes cast by the Executive Council of the Kurunegala District. Later, he became Deputy Chairman and General Secretary of the National Youth Front obtaining the votes of the Executive Members of the Front. His first political battle was as a university student organizing a mass protest campaign throughout the country in 1999 against attempts by the government to reform the education system. During these protests, he was arrested by the police and jailed, and while in prison he earned a reputation as a political fighter. He contested the general election in 2004 and was elected to Parliament with 83114 preferential votes, coming in third place in the candidates list for Kurunegala. Thereafter, the party assigned him the subject of Education and Higher Education and he is performing his duties on this subject in and outside Parliament in a vibrant manner. In 2007 he was appointed as Chairman of the National Youth Front. To bring in a U.N.P government he is doing a great service to the party and he is currently engaged in carrying out his task in a wide political sphere.

Course of Action for Better Education System

As the Minister of Education with a vision for overall human resource development, Hon. Kariyawasam has following plans to improve the system;

- Devising a new educational system to succeed in the changing world
- Drafting the national policy on education
- Devising an educational system in accordance with the job market
- Removing political interference from the educational system
- Improve the quality of teachers for better quality education
- Making Sri Lanka the country with the best educational system in the world
- Establishing enterprises that provide our youth with the opportunity to offer technology services and thereby catalyze a revolutionary change in the local job market.
- Launching educational courses targeting foreign employment opportunities.
